Questions to Consider

What status do I have in my social sphere in school, church, or community?

Do I often try to improve my status? How?

Do I pay special attention to people who are more popular than I am?

How do I treat the "outcasts" of my society?

What would happen to my status if I actively befriended some of these "outcasts"?

Am I more interested in making Jesus popular than in truly following him?

What can I do this week to stop clinging to my status, to put others before myself, or to become a servant like Jesus?

Who am I?

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I know I'm more than an athlete or a brain, an outcast or a rebel.

But that's not the reality of high school.

I'm supposed to be discovering myself, finding myself, but somehow I've been given a label.

It feels like everyone is watching, expecting, waiting for me to fail.

I feel so desperate, alone, invisible, misunderstood, fake.

All I've ever wanted was to be accepted, but now I regret some of the things I've done.

And I'm tired; I'm tired of trying to be who everybody wants me to be.

God, I know it shouldn't matter what others think, but it's hard not to.

I know you want me to be real, to be who you made me to be.

But it's easier to be that way at church, than it is at school.

Lord, help me to surrender to you. Give me courage; give me strength, because I can't do it on my own.

Help me understand that what really matters is what You see, and who You designed me to be.

Help me to be...*that* me.

Principle 1: Sin Grows

Text: James 1:13–15.

Key Question: *How* does sin give birth to death?

Principle 2: Sin Finds Its Own Society

Text: Psalms 1:1–2

Key Question: *Why* is it important to avoid hanging out with mockers, etc.?

Principle 3: Sin has a cycle

Text: Romans 7:18–25. *Also Romans 8 (especially verse 11.)*

Key Question: *How* does Jesus rescue us from this cycle?

Principle 4: Sin doesn't have to define us

Text: Ephesians 2:1–10 (*Read also, 1 Corinthians 9:24–27*)

Key Question: How are we defined in verse 3 and verse 10?
