Take a picture and post it on Harvest This!</p>	<p>April 10</p> <p>Sensory rain stick</p> <p>Fill the cylinder (e.g. water bottle, cardboard tube with the ends covered, etc) with twigs and sticks, and then carefully pour in your smaller items (uncooked rice or beans, sand, seeds, pebbles, etc). Secure the lid and then slowly tip the rain stick from one end to the other to hear the 'rain' sounds inside.</p>	<p>April 11</p> <p>Rock painting</p> <p>Go around your property and look for some rocks. Paint a cross in the middle and paint around the cross. This evening, after the rock dries, place your rocks on different neighbor's doors or steps as a gift to remind them of the hope we have in Jesus.</p>
