

<p>May 17 Bible Verse Memorize this week's bible verse: Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight. Proverbs 3:5-6</p> <p>Make a poster out of the verse and place it somewhere to help others remember to have courage by trusting in God.</p>	<p>May 18 Courage is...</p>  <p>On a piece of paper write what you think courage is. Then draw a picture that shows what you think courage is. Share this with your family or ask mom to let you post it on Facebook.</p>	<p>May 19 Courage Jar Get a jar or a paper cup and decorate the outside with ribbons, paint, markers or draw a picture and glue it to the jar. On a piece of paper write "Courage Jar" and glue it to the outside of the jar. Every time that you do something where you were brave, write it down and put it in the jar. It could be as simple as tasting a new food, sleeping with the lights out or whatever you do that shows courage.</p>	<p>May 20 Fiery Furnace Puppets</p>  <p>Get a paper bag or use a sheet of paper. Cut an opening in the front. Draw and color the picture of 3 guys and glue them on a straw or a stick. You will be using the bag upside down so that you can stick the people in the bag from the bottom. Cut out flames and color red, orange or yellow and glue on what is now the top of the bag. Use this as a puppet show to tell the story of the 3 courageous boys.</p>	<p>May 21 Paper Roll Flowers</p>  <p>Use an empty toilet paper roll. Flatten it out and cut stripes about 1/2 of an inch wide. Arrange the cut pieces into a flower shape. You can use a button, milk top or just color in the center of the flower. Glue to pieces on a paper. Draw the stem and leaves. You can color the inside of the pedals with a marker or paint.</p>	<p>May 22 Sponge Pitch Draw a large circle with chalk. Draw another circle around the first circle leaving about 1 foot of space between each circle. Make 2 additional circles. Write the number 50 in the center circle and for each circle write 40, 30, and 20. Take turns tossing a wet sponge. The water makes it more difficult to maneuver. Keep score to see who can get more points.</p> 	<p>May 23 Bird Watching Can you find a bird making a nest? The birds are busy collecting leaves and other natural materials to make their nest. See if you can find where a bird is making her nest. Watch where they are and what they are carrying to the nest at different times of the day. Draw a picture of what you see.</p>
