<p>June 28 Bible Verse Out of the fullness of his grace he has blessed us all, giving us one blessing after another. John 1:16</p> <p>Write the bible verse on a piece of paper. Cut out each word. Mix them up and see if you can put the verse back together in the right order. Glue them on a piece of paper.</p>	<p>June 29 I Spy a Blessing Sit outside and think about all the blessing that you see that God has given you. On a piece of paper draw pictures of those things. Label each picture. Move to a different spot and look for additional blessings. Continue to add to your pictures.</p>	<p>June 30 Granola Fruit Kabobs Cut into chunks 1 medium apple, 1 small banana and 1/2 cup fresh pineapple. Toss fruit with a small amount of lemon juice to deter browning. Insert toothpicks into each piece of fruit. To serve, dip fruit in yogurt, coat all sides. Roll in granola. Keep cold until ready to serve</p>	<p>July 1 Send a Hug</p>  <p>Think of someone that might need a hug. Trace your hands and cut them out. Cut out a heart shape and cut it out. Glue the heart on a folded paper. Write a message on the heart. Attach yarn from the heart to the traced hands. Fold the card making sure that the hands are inside. When the person that you give the card to opens it, the hands will pop out hanging by the yarn.</p>	<p>July 2 Spray Chalk Collect some spray bottles. Add approximately 1/3 cup of cornstarch to the bottles. Fill up the remainder of the bottle with water and add a generous squirt of food coloring. You can experiment with how much food coloring you need to add to get bright enough colors. Next, swirl and shake the bottles until the cornstarch is integrated. You will need to continue to swirl the bottle as the ingredients settle to the bottom. Go and color your sidewalk. This mixture will mold after 2 days so rinse out the bottles completely and let air out for the next time you use them.</p>	<p>July 3 The American Flag Make an American flag to put out for Independence Day. Remember that the flag should have 13 red and white stripes starting with a red stripe. It has 50 white stars in the blue rectangle of the flag. Glue the flag to a straw, a stick or anything that you have handy. Place it outside in front of your house or place it on a window.</p>	<p>July 4 Fireworks Splatter Painting</p>  <p>Get some acrylic paint and mix with a little water in a cup or bowl. Dip a medium size paintbrush and tap the paintbrush on your two fingers over a piece of paper. The paint should splatter on the paper. Use different colors. Your finish painting will look like fireworks.</p>
