Continue to add picture that show who you are.</p>	<p><b>July 7</b>  <b>Initial Decorating</b></p> <p>Make the initial of your name on cardboard. Cut it out. Look for small things that you can use to decorate it. It can be stickers, ribbons, or cut up gift wrap. You can also add feathers, ruffles, and any other colorful materials that you have at home.</p>	<p><b>July 8</b>  <b>God Made Us Unique</b>                      Your handprints are unique to you. Pour some paint on a shallow plate. Dip the palm of your hand in the paint. Press your hands down on a piece of paper. Write your name on the top using decorative lettering like bubble letters. Color the letters in your favorite color. Post the handprints up on a wall after it dries.</p>	<p><b>July 9</b>  <b>Talent Show</b>                      God made each of us with talents. Some are good with drawing, singing, or acting. Some like sports and some like to work with numbers.                      Have everyone in the family prepare for a talent show. Each person will show how God made each one unique.</p>	<p><b>July 10</b>  <b>Self Portraits</b>                      Make a picture frame from a piece of cardboard. Use markers or paint to decorate the frame. Cut out a piece of paper to fit the size of the frame. Trace very lightly with a pencil the inside of the frame so that you know where to draw. Make a self-portrait of yourself. It could be whole body, head and shoulders, or just your face. You decide. Glue the paper on the back of the frame showing your portrait through the frame.</p>	<p><b>July 11</b>  <b>Balloon Race</b>                      Give everyone a balloon. All the balloons should be the same size. Stretch out the balloon gently to make it easier to blow up. At the count of 3, each person will blow up a balloon. After a period, stop the race and see who was able to blow up the balloon the most.</p>
